Competitions have included cross country (A, B, C teams), boccia (A and B teams including children from the Learning Resource Base), cricket (A team including children from the Learning Resource Base), football (A, B, C teams) and indoor athletics (A team).</p> <p>Providing a greater range of competitive opportunities has meant that a larger number of pupils have been able to access competition (a total of 77 pupils have attended a competitive sport event so far this academic year, compared to 50 children who competed in the previous academic year. Also, by providing B and C teams, pupils of a wide range of abilities have been able to compete. By representing the school, pupils have an increased sense of pride, team spirit and improved self-esteem.</p>
