

EYFS Areas of Learning

Personal, Social and Emotional

- Settle in to Nursery - Increasingly follow rules, understanding why they are important.
- Reading The Colour Monster book - Talk about their feelings using words like 'happy', 'sad', 'angry' or 'worried'.

Communication and Language

- Use talk to organise themselves and their play: "Let's go on a bus... you sit there... I'll be the driver."

Physical Activity

- Continue to develop their movement, balancing, riding (scooters, trikes and bikes) and ball skills.
- Are increasingly able to use and remember sequences and patterns of movements which are related to music and rhythm.
- Use large-muscle movements to wave flags and streamers, paint and make marks.

Literacy

- Enjoy listening to stories and
 - print has meaning
 - page sequencing
 - we read English text from left to right and from top to bottom

Maths

- Recite numbers past 5
- Know that the last number reached when counting a small set of objects tells you how many there are in total.

Understanding the World

- Use all their senses in hands-on exploration of natural materials

Expressive Arts and Design

- Explore different materials freely.

Here are some activities your child can have a go at home to support their learning in Nursery. Any activities completed can be sent into school and we will celebrate this in key group times. This can be recorded however you want to e.g. photographs, writing etc. and can be emailed in to nursery@springdaleprimary.co.uk

- Practise getting yourself dressed for school. Can you put your coat on by yourself? Check you have your shoes on the correct feet!
- Read a story with a grown up every day. This could be a story from our Nursery library, a book from home or from your public library.
- Sing along with our Nursery rhymes. Your child will bring home a new rhyme every two weeks that we will be singing in Nursery, please practise it at home.
- Practise saying numbers 0-5 in order. This could be saying numbers in order whilst playing games like hide and seek or counting jumps or steps when you are on a journey somewhere.
